Dear Peoples Church Family:

There is an old spiritual that describes the loneliness and trial of Jesus during Holy Week it simply states, Jesus walked this lonesome valley. This Holy Week is like none other we have faced before. We collectively we feel the heaviness of the valley. Many in our congregation are healthcare providers, some of us have lost loved ones or know those who are ill. We feel the loneliness of the valley. We are unable to gather together, to find our way to our favorite pew, to wave across the aisle to each other, to gaze at the dazzling rose windows, and be reassured by the melodies from our Moller Organ.

These are indeed challenging and trying times. It was challenging, for those who journeved through the first Holy Week. Jesus disciples felt the fear of seeing their teacher and friend handed over to be crucified. Jesus bore the great agony of death. His disciples lingered at the tomb on Holy Saturday with no hope of a resurrection. We need Holy Week, we need to be reminded that God knows the sorrows of our lives. We need the stories of Peter and his denial of Jesus, of Joseph and the borrowed tomb, of Mary and those who gathered at the foot of the cross. For in their human stories we find our story, all of us saints and sinners, lost and found, fearful and brave.

We need Holy Week dear Church for in it we find the heart of our faith. Darkness never has the last word. We may walk through a dark valley but there is a rolled stone, there are angels waiting to proclaim good news, there is an empty tomb, and a risen savior. Church, we are a resurrection people! Our faith has declared through the centuries that even in the darkest hour, our lives are grounded in a great hope. That Jesus died, rose, and will come again. We anchor ourselves in the good news of the resurrection, death, fear, anxiety, despair never have the last word.

Bill Gaither, penned these words in a hymn that sums up our Easter faith so well. "Because He lives I can face tomorrow, Because He lives all fear is gone, Because I know He holds the future And life is worth the living just because He lives." I pray that the good news of the resurrection will give you joy, hope, and peace. Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

Confirmation Class 2020


Due to the Coronavirus and Church closing, Confirmation 2020 has been canceled until further notice.

Evangelism & Outreach: A Core Value

The Evangelism & Outreach (E&O) Committee invites you to journey with us as we transition our approach toward E&O. We believe that E&O is a core value of the church, which does not need a separate committee. Jesus commanded his disciples to "go out and spread the Good News" in Matthew 28:16-20. The responsibility of the Great Commission may often seem like a daunting task given daily life challenges. The activity of church evangelism and outreach is not just the responsibility of the Senior Minster or the E&O Committee. It is everyone's responsibility and relates to how we show up in the world: Evangelism = God's Good News in Action and Outreach = The Church and the Community Working Hand-in-Hand.

Sometimes we overanalyze what E&O looks like or we worry about taking on another commitment. E&O is simply the sharing of one's faith through testimony, random acts of kindness and compassion we extend to others. It's the seed of faith and a sense of belonging as we engage in intercessory prayer on behalf of someone facing a challenge. It's the seed of compassion you extend as you pass by someone on the street. We share the Gospel consistent with the parable of the sower (found in Matthew 13:1-23, Mark 4:1-20, and Luke 8:4-15). The "seeds" approach looks for ways to improve church recognition and advancing church growth within Ward 4, Petworth and other surrounding areas.

We plant the seeds of faith, hope and love every day in dynamic and often quiet ways. We practice E&O more than you think and perhaps the season of Lent can help raise our awareness and understanding about what it means to "share the Good News". Here are examples from several church members:

- While getting her own lunch, she leverages the McDonald's \$1 menu to buy hamburgers for the homeless man sleeping on a grate downtown. She greets him with a smile and a hamburger!
- Three generations of men from the same family help support the community SHARE program (Peoples UCC is a host site). SHARE is a community food program, providing affordable groceries each month for \$22. Each order provides several meals, consisting of meats, fresh vegetables and pantry staples
- He has his own health challenges but still finds time to provide rides to church for elderly members
- For the past several years during Lent, she coordinates with women at Peoples UCC, other area churches to collect and distribute a variety of community needs: food, clothing, household items, children's school supplies and books
- He observes a troubled person begging for money at a gas station. He offers to pray with them as he continues to pump gas
- She opened her home over the holidays for a group of members to prepare and send Christmas cards to incarcerated persons
