The Ethics of Faith & Work: A Webinar for Federal Employees and Related Workers Monday, February 3, 2025 7:30-9 pm

In 2025 those working within and in partnership with Federal agencies will likely face situations requiring moral discernment and ethical clarity. This webinar will explore key frameworks and resources to help those who work in and with the government respond from their own faith values to a range of potential policy and personnel decisions. The webinar, offered to UCC congregants in the DMV, will *not* offer a one size fits all solution or easy answers to complex situations. It will provide space for participants to begin working through their own values, commitments, and redlines.

Facilitator: We will be led by Dr. Tim Snyder, a practical theologian and scholar of American religion who works at the intersection of church and society. Dr. Snyder has written on the work of Dietrich Bonhoeffer and is the author of *Lived Vocation: Stories of Faith and Work* (Fortress Press, 2024).

NOTICE TO CHURCH MINISTRIES, CLUBS, ORGANIZATIONS

Many ministries within the Peoples Church have become accustomed to receiving donations through the church and later receiving a check for their funds. However, this practice, its associated expenses, and the required processing time have grown, so the church can no longer support it.

You may recall that the Treasurer managed the funds transfer. People's Church has been without a treasurer for over two years, and it is not prudent for the church to pay an accountant to oversee this function. In addition to having no Treasurer to manage the process, the transaction fees for credit cards and other electronic payment transactions are withdrawn from the church bank account monthly.

Starting March 1, 2025, ministries, clubs, circles, and organizations will be asked to manage their funds directly rather than having them deposited into the church account. The dropdown will no longer be an option on the church's financial systems.

For credit card transactions, you can investigate Square, Clover, Merchant Services, PayPal, and other options.

Peoples Church will no longer manage the following ministry, clubs, and organizations: Balcony Circle, Camelia Circle, Boy Scouts, Deacon Dues, Easter Advent, Girls Scouts, Hospitality Circle, Jazz Society Dues, Lenten, Men's Fellowship, Scrooby Circle, Women's Fellowship, Women's Fellowship Dues, and Xmas Advent.

UCC offerings such as Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM), Neighbors in Need, One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, and the Christmas Fund will remain managed through church systems.

- Travel-size toothpaste (3.4 oz. or less, expiration date of 1 year)
- Sturdy wide-tooth comb (6" minimum teeth, packaging removed)

All items need to fit inside a one gallon Ziplock bag.

Do NOT <u>add any extra items or toothpaste</u>. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each hygiene kit just prior to its final journey. Value: \$15.00 <u>Support the Shipping and Processing Fund: \$2.00 per kit.</u>
