#### NOTICE TO CHURCH MINISTRIES, CLUBS, ORGANIZATIONS

Many ministries within the Peoples Church have become accustomed to receiving donations through the church and later receiving a check for their funds. However, this practice, its associated expenses, and the required processing time have grown, so the church can no longer support it.

You may recall that the Treasurer managed the funds transfer. People's Church has been without a treasurer for over two years, and it is not prudent for the church to pay an accountant to oversee this function. In addition to having no Treasurer to manage the process, the transaction fees for credit cards and other electronic payment transactions are withdrawn from the church bank account monthly.

Starting March 1, 2025, ministries, clubs, circles, and organizations will be asked to manage their funds directly rather than having them deposited into the church account. The drop-down will no longer be an option on the church's financial system.

For credit card transactions, you can investigate Square, Clover, Merchant Services, PayPal, and other options. Peoples Church will no longer manage the following ministry, clubs, and organizations: Balcony Circle, Camelia Circle, Boy Scouts, Deacon Dues, Easter Advent, Girls Scouts, Hospitality Circle, Jazz Society Dues, Lenten, Men's Fellowship, Scrooby Circle, Women's Fellowship, Women's Fellowship Dues, and Xmas Advent.

UCC offerings such as Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM), Neighbors in Need, One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, and the Christmas Fund will remain managed through church systems.

#### Highlights from Our Church Council

#### **Notes from the Moderator:**

#### Parking Spaces -

Effective March 1, WMATA has been occupying 17 parking spaces in the parking lot on weekdays only. Eleven WMATA vehicles will occupy spaces on the fence that abuts Iowa Street. The other six will be by the garden and the house along the fence. The "reserved parking" signs do NOT apply on weekends, and members are free to park anywhere in the parking lot except in spaces reserved for the minister and first-time visitors.

#### New Synagogue Project –

The New Synagogue Project, a community of the Jewish faith, has been utilizing our facilities for a fee, to nurture their children during the Saturday Sabbath. Their membership is very diverse, and we are pleased to embrace the clatter of more little feet in the building on Saturdays. The sharing of our space has been most enlightening to both our members and theirs and they look forward to continuing the relationship through the next few months.

#### • Feasibility Study to Evaluate PCUCC Space-

Clear Real Estate Services has commenced the evaluation of the church property. The officials of Clear Real Estate will be meeting with key groups in the church to discuss the use of PCUCC space and how best to leverage our space to meet the growing needs of the church. The Feasibility Working Group (Laura Minor, Bill Wills, Hampton Cross, Dr. Jenel Wyatt, Officer Ike Jackson and James Gittens) will coordinate with church members and groups to be interviewed by Clear Real Estate Services.

#### • Organ Repair-

The repairs to the Organ commenced in February 2025. The organ chests have been removed by the officials at Daffer Organs and sent to Pennsylvania for repair. The repairs to the roof covering that area were completed in early February. The wall and ceiling damaged by leaks from the roof is being repaired. Repairs of the organ may take several weeks. The organ will still be in use during this time.

#### Use of Church Space by Community Groups-

The church has signed a contract with Pedal-Heads, Inc. for the fourth consecutive year to use the parking lots to host bicycle camps and safety workshops this summer. The Church will also host the Washington Jazz and Arts Institute Camp for youths during the summer months, culminating in a youth concert in the summer. Finally, the church has signed a commitment letter to host a five-week summer camp for youth ages 4-13 this summer in partnership with the Georgia Avenue Family Support Collaborative. While we engage with our community groups, our church-sponsored activities, such as VBS, remain our priority.

#### • Restoration of the Driskell-Faceted Glass Windows-

The contract to clean and place protective covering on the Driskell Faceted Glass windows has been signed, and work to restore the windows will begin this spring. The Hospitality Circle (which is providing funding for the project) will oversee the project in coordination with the Board of Trustees Facilities Committee. This project will take several months to complete, as the vendor is in high demand and one of the few vendors specializing in restoring sacred faceted glass windows. Look for scaffolding along the sides of the church where the windows are located as work begins in earnest this spring.

The Men's Fellowship recently completed A Coat Drive – delivering 30 coats to resupply the free coat closet at Roosevelt High School.

#### The Wellness Corner

#### **ORAL-SYTEMIC HEALTH**

Innumerable studies and research have revealed oral health's connection to systemic health and vice versa, with evidence suggesting that the relationship goes both ways. Most of the research studies have addressed the direct and indirect effect of periodontal disease on systemic health.

#### What is Periodontal Disease?

Periodontal Disease, also known as gum disease, is an infection and inflammation of the gums (gingivitis) and the bone that supports the teeth (periodontitis). The disease is often caused by plaque buildup resulting from poor oral hygiene but can be caused by genetic factors or other health conditions. Dental plaque is a sticky film of bacteria that grows on surfaces in the mouth, especially the teeth. According to CDC, periodontal disease affects 42% of the adult population age 30 and over. Risk factors include a family history of periodontal disease, poor oral hygiene, smoking or chewing tobacco, pregnancy, diabetes, crooked teeth that are hard to clean.

#### How Does Periodontal Disease Affect Systemic Health?

According to the National Institutes of Health over 700 species of bacteria reside in the mouth consisting of good bacteria and bad bacteria. Bad bacteria (pathogenic) can colonize and cause diseases. Two possible mechanisms have been hypothesized to explain how pathogenic bacteria in the oral cavity can be associated with systemic diseases. First, chronic inflammation in the oral cavity can increase the inflammatory markers in the blood stream affecting the bodies' immune response i.e. the bodies' ability to fight diseases. Second, the oral cavity acts as a reservoir for pathogenic bacteria that enter the blood stream and affect the body at a distant site.

#### What Systemic Conditions Are Impacted by Oral Health?

The studies connecting periodontal disease with overall health have included atherosclerosis, cardiovascular disease, stroke, rheumatoid arthritis, osteoporosis, diabetes mellitus, pancreatic cancer, pregnancy and low birth weight, pulmonary disease, kidney disease and Alzheimer's Disease. If you have been diagnosed with any of these conditions or are taking medications, PLEASE ask your medical practitioner or dental provider how these conditions or medications are impacting your oral health. Some medications that might affect oral health include hypertension, diabetes, antidepressants, osteoporosis, blood thinners, cancer, antihistamines, and oral steroids.

#### How Is Your Oral Health Impacted?

Common symptoms of periodontal disease include bleeding gums when you brush and floss, swollen gums, loose and/or missing teeth, bad breath, red or white lesions that do not go away or heal in seven to ten days, and teeth that are separating.

#### **Prevention Measures**

Practice good oral hygiene and schedule regular dental examinations. Be proactive about your health. Provide your dentist with a comprehensive medical history to include prescribed and over the counter medications. Give your physicians your dental history to include any oral complications that you have experienced after a medical procedure or after taking prescribed medications.


