

Recurring Online Giving Donations Discontinued on Website

To maintain the highest level of online giving security, the option for recurring donations has been discontinued from the Peoples Church Online Giving Portal. The following information on the CenPOS update was provided by our Merchant Server. "CenPOS removed the ability for cardholders to login and create recurring payments themselves from the WebPay form. This was apparently one of the ways hackers can process fraudulent transactions on the accounts. Since the recurring option was not used very often by real customers, CenPOS removed the option altogether. "Our Website Manager will continue to provide diligent monitoring of any updates or changes that impact our Online Giving Portal in order to protect and secure all electronic giving transactions.

COVID-19 CONTACT TRACING FORM UPDATE

Each person visiting the Church, for the first time only, with a scheduled appointment, must complete a Contact Tracing Form during the sign-in process. The Contact Tracing Form is posted on the Church website to expedite your sign-in time (peopleschurchucc.org) under Church Forms. The Church Forms Tab can be accessed from the Home Page of the website. The form can be downloaded and printed. Bring the completed form and verification of COVID-19 vaccination when you visit the Church for essential business only. Thank you for your cooperation with this COVID-19 protocol.

Continuing Through the Pandemic

In-Church Worship Services, Activities and Events remain suspended until further notice.

In order for us to continue to operate safely and comply with CDC Guidelines as well as the DC government guidelines, we have put new practices in place. Schedule: Since we can only have a limited number of essential individuals in the building at any one time, a schedule has been set in place.
