

RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS INFECTION (RSV)

RSV is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild cold-like symptoms. The virus is highly contagious and is spread by virus droplets in cough or sneeze or by touching a surface that has been contaminated with the virus. RSV can survive on hard surfaces for many hours. RSV outbreaks are seasonal, usually occurring from October to May, with a peak in February. Most individuals in the US have had an RSV infection in early childhood. However, repeat infections may occur throughout life. While the disease is mild in most healthy adults, the disease can be severe in adults with compromised immune systems and older adults, especially those with underlying heart and lung disease. It can cause wheezing and difficulty breathing due to inflammation of the small airways in the lungs (Bronchiolitis) and pneumonia. Bronchiolitis does not respond to the standard treatments for wheezing due to asthma. Therefore, it may result in hospitalization for supportive treatment such as oxygen and IV fluids.

Two vaccines were licensed in May for use in adults over 60 years. Currently, a single dose is recommended. So far, the vaccine appears to provide some protection for at least two RSV seasons. Additional surveillance and evaluation activities are planned to assess how long the vaccine protects against RSV and whether additional doses will be needed.

While the CDC recommends the vaccine, the decision to receive the vaccine should be made after discussion with your Primary Care Provider.

School of Nursing Announces the Canary Savage Girardeau Award for Health Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion



The UW-Madison School of Nursing is proud to announce the establishment of a new award. Named in honor of the first Black alumnus of the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Nursing, The Canary Savage Girardeau Award for Health Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion reflects the School of Nursing's commitment to building health equity through diversity and inclusion in nursing education and health care.

Girardeau is presently a senior program associate at Summit Health Institute for Research and Education (SHIRE) in Washington, D.C., where she contributes her

nursing expertise to the organization and has been instrumental in implementing wellness circles for District of Columbia residents with chronic conditions. With so many notable achievements throughout her career, Girardeau stresses that she just wants to be remembered as the nurse who made her patients feel comfortable and included in their healthcare journeys. "I think about the fact that people want to participate in getting well and recovering from any ailment that they have, and as nurses, they want our help!" she says. "They want us to recognize them as an active participant in their healing and want to feel as important in the process as the nurse. However, they are usually scared and don't know how to participate. As nurses, we show them how, and we show them how participation speeds their recovery. Patients become appreciative and relieved that they can do something themselves. I want to be remembered as the type of nurse who made that happen for her patients."

Emergency Preparedness at Peoples Church

The Emergency Preparedness Committee at Peoples Church has been hard at work to ensure that, in the event of an emergency, all would know exactly what action to take to ensure their safety. To that end, the Committee has written a plan to address the emergencies that could possibly occur at the Church. The emergencies addressed in the plan include fire, natural disasters, adversarial actions, and medical protocols and procedures. The Committee is very proud to say that our plan has received approval from the DC Fire Department and is now on file with that agency. On May 21, 2016, twenty-six Church volunteers participated in the first of a series of planned training sessions, with a focus on how to evacuate the Church in case of an emergency. Exit signs have been placed throughout the Church to guide us in the evacuation process. We would like you to take note of these additions the next time you attend a Church activity. Updates are forthcoming on future training courses, which will include what to do if a natural disaster or an adversarial event should occur, as well as medical emergency protocols and procedures. A major focus of the Committee will be the continued recruitment of Church volunteers to support the Emergency Preparedness efforts. The Emergency Preparedness Committee members are James Butts, former Committee Chair, Yvette Hunter, Isaac Jackson, Jr., Earlene Jenkins, Co-Chair, Dawn Kum, Dr. Esther Pinder, Jean Tate, Co-Chair, and Carolyn Veiga.
