Minister's Message

Dear Members and Friends of Peoples Congregational United Church of Christ,

"A Reflection on A Pastor and People after One Year"

Proverbs 27:17 from the Message translation of the Holy Scriptures reminds us, "You use steel to sharpen steel, and one friend sharpens another." Over the past year, as we have been together as a pastor and people, I have attempted to create causes for us to be together and engage with one another at all levels, allowing those interactions to make each of us sharper/better.
