#### MEMORANDUM

Subject: Gender Neutral Bathroom on Second Floor

I would like to share an important update regarding our church facility. The restroom formerly designated as the boys' restroom on the second level (near the classrooms) has now been converted into a **gender-neutral restroom**. This change reflects our continued commitment to fostering a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment for everyone—especially our children.

To support this transition:

- Updated signage has been installed to clearly indicate the new designation.
- The restroom will be reserved for youth use only.
- For the time being, youth must be accompanied by an adult when using this restroom.
   This policy will be reviewed and adjusted as we all become more familiar with the updated space.

During the summer, after conferring with the Vacation Bible School, we converted the upstairs restroom into a gender-neutral or family restroom to better accommodate program needs. While a permanent renovation is not feasible at this time due to cost constraints, a temporary solution has been implemented:

- The restroom has been used by both male and female participants according to a designated schedule and under adult supervision.
- A partition was installed to conceal the urinals during use by female participants.
- This arrangement has also been adopted by NSP for their program.

We deeply appreciate your understanding and support as we strive to build a community where every individual feels seen, respected, and valued.



You can help grow the music ministry by bringing or inviting a friend or family member to church.



#### Wellness Corner

#### THE CANNABIS HAZE

Cannabis products are often used to help with pain and nausea. Over time, CBD—a compound found in cannabis—has also become popular in skin care and wellness routines. Both THC and CBD are active ingredients that come from the cannabis plant. Products differ based on how much THC they contain. Those with higher THC levels (above 3%) can cause stronger mind-altering effects and are more tightly regulated by federal law.

Using cannabis products with higher THC can sometimes make managing chronic health conditions more difficult for older adults.

Still, many seniors turn to cannabis, especially for pain relief. At first, they used CBD oils and gels on their skin, but now oral and inhaled products are also common. As more states allow medical cannabis, dispensaries are opening up and offering products with more THC. On the other hand, products with more CBD are generally easier to buy.

Studies show that cannabis use among people aged 65 and older has grown rapidly in recent years. Higher THC use is linked to several health conditions, including chronic lung disease (COPD), heart problems, diabetes, high blood pressure, cancer, and having multiple chronic illnesses. Older adults who are female, have higher incomes, advanced education, are married, and live in states where medical cannabis is legal are most likely to use these products. However, using cannabis products with more THC can make managing chronic diseases more complicated for seniors.

Experts currently recommend caution: for most people with non-cancer pain, the risks of cannabis use may outweigh the benefits—especially for those with substance use issues, serious mental illness, frailty, or a high risk of falling.

Products with the higher CBD content often referred to as hemp, contain nutrients like proteins, fatty acids, and minerals that support brain and skin health, reduce inflammation, and aid digestion. Many older adults use CBD for pain relief, relaxation, anxiety, and sleep—starting with topical oils and gels, and now also oral and inhaled products. CBD products are known for their calming effects and mental clarity, without the "buzz" of high-THC products and may help improve sleep and recovery.

CBD-infused drinks and hemp seed oils are also popular, especially in health-focused beauty products.

However, daily CBD use can cause side effects like dry mouth, drowsiness, and digestive issues. High doses may lead to anxiety, increased heart rate, dizziness, and fatigue.

Because of the opioid crisis, more people are looking for natural alternatives, but it's important to know that newer cannabis plants with higher THC often have less CBD. With

no federal regulation, product quality and safety can vary, and we don't yet know all the risks.

Cannabis can also interact with medications, so always talk to your physician or pharmacist before using these products.

In short: be careful and make informed choices.
